

---

During the month of April, Deputies assigned to the Cooper City District responded to 2673 calls for service. Of these calls for service, a total of 53 are Part One (Persons and Property Crimes). The remaining 2,620 calls are alarms, police service suspicious incidents, 911 hang ups, etc.

There were a total of 8 residential burglaries, 21 conveyance burglaries and 3 auto theft. There were 39 arrests during the month in which some are documented below in the Items of Interest section of this report.

A total of 74 code violations were addressed during the month of April. These violations are initiated by Patrol Deputies, Parking Enforcement Personnel and Code Enforcement Inspectors. Many of these cases and will require additional follow-up action.

Also included in this report is a breakdown of the 172 State Traffic Citations and 210 Traffic Warnings issued by District Deputies. The Accident Report by Zone lists a total of 88 accidents investigated by District Deputies during the month of April, there were no traffic fatalities.

## SIGNIFICANT ARRESTS

**JUVENILES** – On April 11, 2018, a 15-year old Cooper City resident and his 12-year-old brother were arrested for burglarizing the St. Nicholas Ukrainian Orthodox Church and a nearby residence.

**Jacob Brennan** – On April 14, 2018, deputies located Jacob Brennan and David Stauffer after a female claimed they tried to steal her purse at Walmart. The victim departed the scene before deputies could obtain specifics regarding the incident. Brenna provided a fake name to deputies and, once positively identified, was found to have active warrants for Felony Robbery with Bodily Injury and Felony Robbery with Gang Activity. He was additionally found to be in possession of narcotics.

**David Stauffer** – On April 15, 2018, deputies arrested David Stauffer after the Shell gas station clerk reported that Stauffer attempted to break into the business by pulling and kicking the door; however the store had been locked for the night and service was only available through the window. Stauffer then walked over to the clerk's vehicle. He looked into the window, put on latex gloves, and pulled the passenger door handle (the clerk's purse was sitting on the passenger seat). He then returned to the store and attempted to open the door before leaving the area.

**Kennthe Brown** – On April 21, 2018, Kennthe Brown was arrested for obtaining a fraudulent driver's license and credit card in the victim's name to purchase jewelry. The victim (a resident of The Country) had video surveillance of his mail being stolen and was alerted to the identity theft after receiving unsolicited mail from a jewelry store. Detectives took Brown into custody when he responded to the jewelry store to pick up the fraudulently purchased jewelry.

**JUVENILES** – On April 24, 2018, detectives arrested a 17-year-old and a 13-year-old in Belle Glade following an investigation into vehicle burglaries and a stolen vehicle from Flamingo Gardens. The juveniles were in a stolen vehicle and were in possession of burglary tools during their arrest.

**Sol Blocker** – On April 28, 2018, Sol Blocker committed a vehicle burglary at Brian Piccolo Park. He attempted to flee from deputies but was apprehended. Blocker was found to be in possession of property stolen during burglaries at Tradewinds Park earlier that day.

## CRIME TRENDS

**RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES** – Residential burglaries typically occur when homes are vacant – like when residents are at work, school, or out of town. Typically burglars will confirm the vacancy by first knocking on the door. Once they receive no answer, the burglar responds to the backyard where they can discreetly make entry to the home. There were however recent occurrences involving entry or attempted entry via the front door. Burglars typically steal small electronics, cash, and jewelry as they are portable as well as profitable. Below are residential burglaries that occurred in April 2018:

**Rock Creek** – Between April 1, 2018 at noon and April 2, 2018 at noon, an unknown person attempted to pry open two doors at the victim's residence (W Quayside Dr) while he was out of town. The victim's mother was housesitting and discovered the damaged doors. The garbage cans were left out and there were no cars in the driveway, so it is possible the residence appeared vacant during the time of the attempted burglary.

**Rock Creek (Le Cristal subdivision)** – On April 4, 2018 between 7:40am to 3:00pm, an unknown person smashed the sliding glass door of the victim's residence. Once inside, the suspect ransacked two bedrooms, stealing cash and jewelry.

**10550 Griffin Road** – On April 4, 2018, the victim's residence was forcefully entered and ransacked during the night. The following night, the residence was entered again through the previously damaged door and this time the attic was checked for valuables. The same night, the **St. Nicholas Ukrainian Orthodox Church** was also burglarized, during which a religious necklace needed for church services was stolen. During the night of April 10, 2018, the church was burglarized a second time, during which the suspects caused damage but did not steal anything. Investigation revealed a 15-year-old Cooper City resident and his 12-year-old brother committed these burglaries. The religious necklace was returned to the church.

**Cooper Colony Estates** (\*suspicious incident\*) – On April 8, 2018 at approximately 10:45pm, the resident heard what sounded like someone attempting to unlock the *front door* by using the deadbolt keypad several times. When the resident looked out the window, she observed a white Cadillac (possibly 2007/2008 CTS model) driving by the front of the house. After checking with a neighbor, it was determined this vehicle had been driving around the neighborhood for approximately 30 minutes prior to the incident.

**The Country** – During the afternoon of April 9, 2018 (between 1:00pm and 5:00pm), an unknown person entered the victim's *unlocked front door* and stole a 55" Samsung television from the master bedroom.

**Cooper Colony Estates** – Between April 9, 2018 at 10:00pm and April 10, 2018 at 6:00pm, an unknown person entered an *unlocked front door* and stole jewelry as well as a pillow case (likely to carry the jewelry) from the bedroom. The suspect also entered an RV which was parked in the backyard and removed cash from the bedroom closet.

**Monterra (Estada at Monterra)** – On April 21, 2018 at approximately 10:00pm, an unknown person entered the residence through an unlocked bathroom window and stole cash and jewelry from the master bedroom nightstands.

**Flamingo Gardens** – On April 19, 2018 between 1:30am and 9:00am, an unknown person forced open the victim's locked gate and entered the backyard. Once inside, the suspect encountered the resident's dog. The suspect stabbed the dog in the neck and then fled the area. The dog was taken to the hospital where it received thirty stitches to close the wound. It is unknown whether the suspect was attempting to gain access to a trailer in the victim's backyard.

**The Country** – On April 23, 2018 at approximately 10:25am, the suspect pried open a jalousie window and unlawfully entered the home. The suspect stole jewelry from a bedroom before fleeing the residence. Due to surveillance footage, the suspect was identified as Ryan Ouimet (a 28-year-old Davie resident). During Ouimet's arrest, several pillow cases of jewelry were located in his residence. Some of the jew Morgan, was arrested for providing Oimet with assistance following the Cooper City burglary.

---

**NEIGHBORHOOD VEHICLE BURGLARIES** – This recent trend has increased throughout Broward County. Typically burglars work in groups to walk neighborhoods and pull on vehicle door handles during the night. Once a vehicle is found to be unlocked, it is searched

for valuables, or stolen if keys are present. Typically burglars focus solely on *unlocked* vehicles, and they move quickly through the area. Below are cases that occurred during April 2018:

**Cooper Colony Estates** – During the night of April 11, 2018, an unknown suspect entered the victim's *unlocked* vehicle and rummaged through it.

**Monterra (Vista Del Sol)** – During the night of April 15, 2018, an unknown suspect entered six *unlocked* vehicles and cash, electronics, credit cards, and other personal items. One of the owners received an alert that her vehicle was opened at 2:00am. Credit cards stolen from one of the other vehicles were later used to make fraudulent purchases. A purse of one of the victims was located in a neighbor's yard.

**Cooper Colony Estates** – On April 15, 2018 at approximately 3:00am, the suspects went to a residence where there were two *unlocked* vehicles in the driveway. One of the vehicles had keys in the ignition and was stolen. The resident observed the vehicle driving away, but assumed it was his son leaving the house. That vehicle was found in Miami one day later with significant damage.

**Flamingo Gardens** – On April 22, 2018 at approximately 3:00am, a concerned neighbor called 911 to report that several males were possibly breaking into vehicles. The suspects were gone upon deputies' arrival. Surveillance videos showed five young males in the neighborhood pulling the door handles of residents' parked vehicles. Investigation revealed that approximately 20 *unlocked* vehicles were burglarized, and one of the vehicles was stolen. Following the Cooper City burglaries, the victim's stolen vehicle was used to commit multiple vehicle burglaries throughout Broward and Royal Palm Beach. It was located three days later in Belle Glade. While detectives were conducting surveillance, two juvenile males (one 17-year-old and one 13-year-old) arrived in another stolen vehicle. When taken into custody, the males were found to be in possession of burglary tools.

**Royal Griffin Estates** – On April 30, 2018 at approximately 4:00am, an unknown male entered the victim's *unlocked* vehicle and rummaged through the interior. Video surveillance showed the male, who was wearing a hoodie, being followed by a four-door sedan.

---

**PLAZA VEHICLE BURGLARIES** – Some locations, like gym parking lots, are targeted because people typically leave purses or laptop bags in their vehicles while they are inside the facility. At other locations, the burglary is merely a *crime of opportunity* because valuables were visible from outside the vehicle. In the last few months, vehicles have been burglarized at Retro Fitness, Cooper City Commons, Countryside Shops, and Rise Community Church. These burglaries occur during normal business hours and often involve valuables, or perceived valuables, in view from outside the vehicle. See below for the specifics on a vehicle burglary that took place in a plaza in April 2018:

**Shoppes of Cooper City** – On April 7, 2018, two employees left backpacks inside their locked vehicles while they were working inside Angelo's Pizza. Between approximately 11:00am and 4:00pm, an unknown suspect smashed the vehicles' windows and stole the backpacks from inside.

---

**PARK VEHICLE BURGLARIES** – Park parking lots are targeted because victims typically leave valuables in vehicles while they exercise or play with their children. From January to March, one vehicle at Jerry Morgan Park and approximately 17 vehicles at Brian Piccolo Park were burglarized. Nearly every case involved a female victim who returned to her vehicle to find her window smashed and purse stolen from within. None of the burglaries have been fruitless, meaning there have been no vehicles entered that did not result in a theft. This indicates the suspects knew valuables were located in the vehicle, whether in plain view (clearly visible through the window) or attempts to hide valuables were likely viewed (suspect observed the victim stuffing the purse under a seat). Below are vehicle burglaries that occurred at parks during April 2018:

**Cooper City Sports Complex** – On April 2, 2018 between 7:00pm and 8:10pm, while the victim was at her son's sporting event, she placed her purse inside her trunk. An unknown person entered the vehicle either through the unlocked passenger door or possibly an improperly closed trunk and stole the purse. The suspect then attempted to cash two of the victim's checks.

**Brian Piccolo** – On April 12, 2018 at approximately 8:45am, an unknown person smashed the window of the victim's vehicle and stole her backpack with contents from within.

**Christie Schafale Park** – On April 12, 2018 at approximately 9:56am, the victim parked her car and was exercising at the park with friends. She heard her window being smashed and then observed a male driving a newer model white Mercedes speed away. A white female (5'7", 30s, black dress, gray sweater) was seen walking in the area prior to the burglary, but was gone when the Mercedes fled. It is unknown if she was possibly involved.

**Brian Piccolo Park** – On April 23, 2018 at approximately 8:15pm, an unknown person smashed the windows of two vehicles while the owners were inside the velodrome. A satchel was stolen from the passenger floorboard of one of the vehicles.

**Brian Piccolo Park** – On April 26, 2018 at approximately 9:30am, an unknown person smashed the window of the victim's vehicle while she was exercising. The suspect stole the victim's purse which had been hidden under the front passenger seat. The license plate of the suspect vehicle was entered into the LPR database.

**Brian Piccolo Park** – On April 28, 2018 at approximately 2:00pm, the suspect vehicle from the previous burglary returned to the park and deputies were alerted via the LPR system. As deputies responded, the suspect smashed the window of a vehicle and stole a purse from the rear passenger seat. When deputies located the vehicle, the occupant Sol Blocker (21-year-old Miami Gardens resident) attempted to flee on foot. He was subsequently apprehended. The victim's purse was located inside Blocker's vehicle, along with property stolen during burglaries at Tradewinds Park earlier that day.

---

**MAIL THEFT AND FRAUD** – In January, BSO received reports of suspicious males inquiring when the mail would be delivered in areas of Cooper City. Later that month, two residents reported theft of mail from their mailboxes, one of which contained checks the suspect later attempted to cash. In March, there were several more reports of either missing mail or stolen mail. In April, there were multiple cases involving identity theft and fraud – several of which had connections to mail. In those cases, the suspects applied for credit cards or made purchases which were delivered to the victim's residence, however they were intercepted by the suspect. While it's unknown how the victims' information was compromised in all the cases, residents should be cautious of this trend. Below are some fraud and mail theft cases from April 2018:

**Flamingo Ranches** - On April 4, 2018, Fedex delivered a Verizon phone to the victim's residence. A friend was at the victim's residence, so she immediately attempted to remove the package from the porch. She was suddenly approached by a black male (5'6", accent, yellow hat, black Gucci shirt) who claimed that the package belonged to him and he had the tracking number on his phone as proof. Because the package was addressed to the victim, she did not relinquish the package. The victim contacted Verizon and learned that his personal information had been used to fraudulently order the phone. Earlier in the day, an anonymous caller reported a suspicious black male in a light blue Infiniti low-rider with passenger-side damage who was loitering in the area.

**Country Address** – On April 28, 2018, the victim discovered that an unknown person applied for a Verizon account using his personal information. The account was in default by over \$2,000. It is unknown how and where the personal information was compromised.

**The Country** – Security cameras at the residence showed a black female stealing mail from the victim's mailbox on two separate occasions. After later receiving unsolicited mail from Zales jewelry store, the victim ran his credit report through Experian and learned several fraudulent accounts had been opened using the victim's personal information. One of the accounts indicated the suspect purchased jewelry at the Pembroke Lakes mall. Because the suspect left the jewelry to be sized, detectives awaited his arrival and took him into custody on April 21<sup>st</sup>. The suspect, Kenneth Brown (25-year-old Miami resident), admitted he had used a fraudulent driver's license (with the victim's name, date of birth, address, and DL number) and credit card (which had been applied for with the victim's personal information) to purchase the jewelry.

**Guardian Estates** – On April 30, 2018, the owner of the residence recently moved and had mail forwarded to his new residence in Port St. Lucie. He began receiving forwarded mail, including credit cards, he did not apply for. It is unknown how his personal information was compromised.

**Cooper Colony Estates** – On April 25, 2018, the resident reported that an unknown person used his Chase debit card to pay a Capital One account that he never received a card for. It is unknown how

his personal information was compromised.

**Country Glen** – a resident of Country Glen reported that an unknown person used his personal information to open credit accounts in Snellville, Georgia. It is unknown how his information was compromised.





## Crash Type & Crash Severity






