

Subject: June 2018 Report

During the month of June, Deputies assigned to the Cooper City District responded to 2595 calls for service. Of these calls for service, a total of 26 are Part One (Persons and Property Crimes). The remaining 2569 calls are alarms, police service suspicious incidents, 911 hang ups, etc.

There were a total of 5 conveyance burglaries and 1 residential burglaries. There were 23 arrests during the month in which some are documented below in the Items of Interest section of this report.

A total of 115 code violations were addressed during the month of June. These violations are initiated by Patrol Deputies, Parking Enforcement Personnel and Code Enforcement Inspectors. Many of these cases and will require additional follow-up action.

Also included in this report is a breakdown of the 298 State Traffic Citations and 513 Traffic Warnings issued by District Deputies. The Accident Report by Zone lists a total of 55 accidents investigated by District Deputies during the month of June, there were no traffic fatalities.

Items of Interest :

SIGNIFICANT ARRESTS

Thomas Ingram – Walmart Loss Prevention started surveilling Thomas Ingram, who had been seen shoplifting in the past. Mr. Ingram walked to the electronics section and removed security devices from over \$300 worth of merchandise. He placed the merchandise into his waistband and attempted to leave the store. When confronted by a Loss Prevention, Mr. Ingram pushed the employee and fled out the door. BSO deputies located Mr. Ingram in the parking lot; however he fled from them into a nearby wooded area. Mr. Ingram was taken into custody by a BSO canine and charged with Strong Arm Robbery.

CRIME TRENDS

RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES – Burglars typically target homes they believe to be unoccupied because it limits their chance of confronting a resident who may intervene or call police. Because residents are typically at work or school during the day, burglars tend to target homes during this time. However, there have been cases wherein the burglar targeted homes during the evening/night hours, including one case in June 2018:

Royal Griffin Estates – On June 18th between 6:00pm and 11:00pm, an unknown person entered the victim's residence through an unlocked sliding glass door. Once inside, the suspect stole jewelry and loose change from the master bedroom and adjacent office. Investigation revealed the suspect initially attempted to gain entry via a garage window, but was unable to due to a shelf within the garage.

NEIGHBORHOOD VEHICLE BURGLARIES – This recent trend has increased throughout Broward County. Typically burglars work in groups to walk neighborhoods and pull on vehicle door handles during the night. Once a vehicle is found to be unlocked, it is searched for valuables, or stolen if keys are present. Typically burglars focus solely on *unlocked* vehicles, however they may make forced entry if valuables are in view. Below are cases that occurred during May 2018:

Rock Creek (Camelot Gardens) – During the night of June 8th, unknown persons entered five vehicles on the same street. Three unlocked vehicles were entered and rummaged through, one vehicle's window was smashed (visible lap top bag stolen from inside), and one unlocked vehicle was stolen (key fob left inside).

Forest Lake – During the night of June 18th, an unknown person entered the victim's unlocked vehicle and rummaged through the interior. Earbuds and a bag were stolen.

PLAZA VEHICLE BURGLARIES – Some locations, like gym parking lots, are targeted because people typically leave purses or laptop bags in their vehicles while they are inside the facility. At other locations, the burglary is merely a *crime of opportunity* because valuables were visible from outside the vehicle. See below for the specifics on vehicle burglaries that took place in a plazas during June 2018:

Walmart – On June 6, 2018 at approximately 10:00pm, an unknown person opened an unlocked vehicle and removed a wallet from on top of the passenger seat.

Aroma Supermarket – On June 20th between 11:00am and 1:00pm, an unknown person smashed the window of an employee's vehicle and stole her purse from the passenger floorboard.

AUTO THEFT – In recent past months, auto thefts occurring in Cooper City have involved key fobs left in vehicles, indicating suspects simply tried the ignition of unlocked vehicles and stole whichever ones started. During this month, cars were stolen both with and without keys present:

Embassy Lakes – During the night of June 7th, an unknown person stole a Mitsubishi Outlander from in front of the victim's house. The vehicle had been left unlocked with the key fob inside. On June 11th, the vehicle was recovered in Miami.

Country Glen – During the night of June 14th, an unknown person stole a 2017 Jeep Grand Cherokee from the victim's driveway. According to the victim, the keys were not inside the vehicle. The victim's phone and wallet were inside the vehicle prior to the theft. The phone was later located approximately 300 yards from the victim's residence. The victim's credit card was used to make fraudulent purchases in Southwest Ranches and Weston.

MAIL THEFT AND FRAUD – There has been a growing trend involving fraud and mail theft. This has included suspects opening fraudulent phone accounts or applying for credit under the victim's name. When the credit card or merchandise is delivered, the suspect (who tracked the delivery) intercepts the package before the victim. Often times, the victim is unaware of the theft until the account is several months in default. Below are two cases that occurred in June:

Cooper Colony Estates – On June 2, 2018 at approximately 2:30pm, a resident was informed by the FedEx driver that an unknown male attempted to intercept the victim's package. The male even presented a fraudulent driver's license with the victim's name and a different picture. Due to numerous incidents involving fraud and mail theft, the FedEx driver refused to relinquish the package and instead delivered it to the victim. The suspect was described as a white male, possibly Hispanic, in his mid-30s, 5'7"-5'9", medium build, and wearing a green t-shirt, black shorts, black sneakers, and sunglasses. He fled in a convertible Mercedes Benz. According to the FedEx driver, this same suspect unsuccessfully attempted to intercept another package in the neighborhood earlier the same day.


Flamingo Gardens – On June 14, 2018 at 2:50pm, the resident observed a silver four-door vehicle pull up to his mailbox ten minutes after the mail was delivered. A black male, who was approximately 20-30 years old and wearing a royal blue hoodie, reached out the driver window and stole the mail from the mailbox. According to the victim, on June 4th he was notified by Life Lock (credit monitoring service) that someone ordered two bank cards and a credit card under his name. Following the mail theft, the resident and his wife conducted another check of their credit history and learned that numerous credit card and bank accounts had been opened under their names.


June 2018 - Accidents

Crash Type & Direction of Travel







Light & Weather Conditions





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



I. CODE ENFORCEMENT

Handle applicable county court prosecutions for code violations and related activities. Provide legal services for preparation and presentation of cases before city special magistrate; and assist in facilitating the operation of successful special magistrate program (Jose Arango);

II. LITIGATION

1) Defend City in fire assessment case. The Circuit Court granted plaintiff's motion to certify a class of plaintiffs. We had filed a Notice of Appeal of that preliminary ruling to the Fourth District Court of Appeal, as authorized by the City Manager; and have filed the City's Briefs. Oral argument was held at the 4th District on November 5, 2013. By Per Curiam decision of November 14, 2013, the 4th District (without a written opinion) affirmed the Circuit Court's certification of a class of plaintiffs to allow the case to proceed as a class action. Since the appellate court decision returned the case to the Trial Court, the previous stay or hold on trial court proceedings is removed, and the defense of the case will proceed at the Trial Court level pursuant to the several defenses asserted in the City's previously filed Answer and Affirmative Defenses. On June 2, 2014, the Trial Court issued an Agreed Order requiring the Plaintiffs to publish and mail a notice of the pending class action litigation, as required by the rules governing class actions, so that persons who are alleged to be part of the class may know of the class action and may decide whether to remain in or exclude themselves from the class action as the case proceeds. Plaintiffs mailed and published a notice, and repeated the notice process because of a defect in the return mailing address that they used in the first attempted notice. Plaintiffs filed a motion for partial summary judgment. Plaintiffs subsequently filed an amended motion for partial summary judgment. A

hearing was held on the motion for partial summary judgment on July 7, 2015. The Court took the matter under advisement upon the conclusion of that hearing. On July 20, 2015, the Court determined that Plaintiff's challenge to the 2006 fiscal year fire assessments is barred by the statute of limitations. Subsequently, by Order of September 10, 2015, the Court ruled in the City's favor on the Plaintiffs' motion for partial summary judgment by denying that motion. On October 28, 2015, Plaintiffs filed another Motion for Summary Judgment. On November 4, 2015, the City filed its Motion for Summary Judgment. A case status conference was held by the Court on December 16, 2015. The Circuit Court held a hearing on the respective motions for summary judgment on February 15, 2016. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Court took the matter under advisement and announced that it would rule in the future. Subsequently, the Court issued an Order dated April 14, 2016, a copy of which was obtained on April 18, 2016, in which the Court denied the City's Motion for Summary Judgment, and granted, in part, the Plaintiff's Motion for Summary Judgment concerning some of the City's affirmative defenses, including the City's affirmative (and well founded) defense that Plaintiff's suit is prohibited as not timely filed within the 20 day jurisdictional standard of the Fire Assessment enabling Ordinance and Resolutions. A standard court ordered mediation was held as previously scheduled on April 19, 2016, and a further court- ordered mediation may be held before the trial. The Court held a pre- trial conference on June 16, 2016, and expressed an intent to have found that the fire assessment was not properly apportioned between residential and other assessed properties. On June 21, 2016, the Plaintiffs, for the first time, presented a settlement proposal for City consideration. On July 5, 2016, the Court issued a Final Judgment reflecting that the Plaintiffs dismissed Count I (which had alleged that funds from the special assessment were used for EMS) and declaring that the apportionment was improper as to Count II. As requested by the City Manager, the City filed its appeal to the Fourth District Court of Appeal on July 19, 2016. Plaintiffs belatedly filed a motion in the trial court seeking to have that court declare that the plaintiffs are entitled to a fire assessment refund in an unspecified amount. However, since the case was pending on appeal to the Fourth District Court of Appeal, the trial court did not have jurisdiction to consider that motion. The City's appellate brief was filed at the end of October, 2016. The Plaintiff's answer brief was filed on February 2, 2017. The City's reply brief and request for oral argument were filed at the end of March, 2017. Oral argument was held at the Fourth District Court of Appeal on June 13, 2017. On September 27, 2017, the Fourth District Court of Appeal issued its Opinion reversing the trial court and directing that the trial court enter judgment in favor of the City of Cooper City. The appellate Court determined that the plaintiffs' attempted challenge to the 2006-2009 fire assessments was prohibited by the Fire Assessment Ordinance's 20 day time deadline applicable to any challenge to the apportionment of fire assessments. On October 12, 2017, the plaintiffs filed a motion for rehearing in



the appellate court. On October 23, 2017, the City filed a response to that motion. On October 26, 2017, the Fourth District Court of Appeal denied plaintiffs' motion. On November 21, 2017, plaintiffs attempted to appeal to the Florida Supreme Court by filing a "Notice to Invoke Discretionary Jurisdiction". Jurisdictional briefs were filed by the parties. On June 28, 2018, after review of the record and the jurisdictional briefs, the Florida Supreme Court ordered that the plaintiffs petition for review is **denied**. Accordingly, the Trial Court will shortly be required to enter Final Judgment in favor of the City of Cooper City. We will keep you informed on the matter. (Matt Mandel, Jamie Cole, Ed Guedes);

An attorney- client session to discuss a potential settlement offer was previously held. Settlement approval has been processed by the largest municipalities, and has also been approved by the Broward County Commission. The Settlement was approved at the City Commission meeting of April 28, 2015, and has been approved by all of the other participating cities. Distribution of settlement proceeds to the cities has been made. We are monitoring the County's compliance with the remaining requirements of the settlement and the consideration and approval of amendments, and attending applicable municipal-county follow-up meetings (Jamie Cole);
- 3) Advise on implementation of County ethics ordinances, as amended, and provide advisory opinions, assistance, advice and training on public service ethics when requested (David Wolpin, Robert Meyers);
- 4) As requested by City Manager, assist staff with collection of delinquent utility bills including late fees (Aleida Molina, David Wolpin);
- 5) Assist Growth Management department on land use matters (Kathy Mahaffey, David Wolpin);
- 6) Assist City Manager and Public Works Director with traffic jurisdiction matters (David Wolpin);

- 7) Assist City staff in lien foreclosure defense, bankruptcy claims, and related matters (Aleida Molina);
- 8) Assist City Manager on Pension Plan matters (Milton Collins, David Wolpin);
- 9) Assist City Manager on Public Safety service matters as directed by City Commission (Elen Gantner, Chris Saunders, David Wolpin);
- 10) Assist City Manager on confiscated funds matter and mediation (Elen Gantner, Matt Mandel, David Wolpin) ;
- 11) Assist City Manager and Growth Management department on proposed City Code amendments (Elen Gantner, David Wolpin); and
- 12) Examine Agenda Items for July 17, 2018, City Commission meeting (David Wolpin).
