

Subject: June 2020 Report

During the month of June, Deputies assigned to the Cooper City District responded to 2146 calls for service. Of these calls for service, a total of 25 are Part One (Persons and Property Crimes). The remaining 2121 calls are alarms, police service suspicious incidents, 911 hang ups, etc.

There were a total of 5 conveyance burglaries, 2 auto thefts, 1 robbery and 1 sexual assault. There were 9 arrests during the month in which some are documented the Items of Interest section of this report.

A total of 197 code violations were addressed during the month of June. These violations are initiated by Patrol Deputies, Parking Enforcement Personnel and Code Enforcement Inspectors. Many of these cases and will require additional follow-up action.

Also included in this report is a breakdown of the 19 State Traffic Citations and 27 Traffic Warnings issued by District Deputies. The Accident Report by Zone lists a total of 64 accidents investigated by District Deputies during the month of June, there were no traffic fatalities.

Cooper City Crime Trends

June 2020

NEIGHBORHOOD VEHICLE BURGLARIES – This trend is increasing throughout Broward County. Typically, burglars work in groups to walk neighborhoods and pull on vehicle door handles during the night. Once a vehicle is found to be unlocked, it is searched for valuables, or stolen if keys are present. Typically, burglars focus solely on *unlocked* vehicles, however vehicles with visible valuables or vehicles assumed to contain valuables (like work trucks), may be forcefully entered. The following cases occurred this month:

Stonebridge - Sometime between 8:30 am on June 3, 2020 and June 4th at approximately 12:14 pm unknown subject(s) made entry into his white, 2019 Ford F-250. The glove compartment was found open and hanging as if someone attempted to detach it from the dashboard. Nothing appeared to be stolen from the car.

Embassy Lakes - Between 6:00 pm on June 14, 2020 and the following day at 2:30 pm the convertible top was cut open on a 1997 Mazda Miata and the interior ransacked. The only thing taken were Ray-Ban sunglasses.

Flamingo Gardens - Unknown suspect(s) gained entry into gray Toyota and removed money. Unknown if the vehicle was secure or unlocked

Monterra – Sometime between during the evening hours on June 19, 2020 unknown suspect(s) gained entry (no force) into a Dodge Journey however nothing was removed.

Flamingo Gardens-Live Oak – On June 29, 2020 at approximately 4:008 am three (3) unknown subjects checking vehicle door handles early in the morning and they were able to get into two vehicles at 11501 SW 59 ct. From one vehicle they did not take anything; and from the other one they took a pistol.

AUTO THEFTS – There has been an increase in auto thefts this month. Vehicles may be stolen in a variety of methods, including via tow truck, punched ignitions, or due to the availability of keys. In the case of key fobs left in vehicles, the suspect simply tries the ignition of unlocked vehicles and steals whichever ones start. The following cases occurred this month:

Rock Creek Phase Two – Deputy recovered a stolen vehicle, which was stolen out of Miami. The unknown driver hit a mailbox and bailed out. A perimeter was set up. The Aviation and K9 Units were called out. A search was conducted with no success.

Monterra - Sometime between 11:30 pm on June 19, 2020 and 6:00 am on June 20, 2020, an unknown suspect(s) stole a white 2018 Alfa Romeo Giulia from the driveway of a residence. Vehicle was left unlocked.

Flamingo Gardens – During the late evening hours of June 22, 2020 unknown culprit stole a 2020 Honda Pilot from the driveway.

BUSINESS BURGLARY – Businesses may be specifically targeted because they contain expensive inventory, equipment, and cash registers. They also tend to be unoccupied when closed for operation, which means there is less opportunity for witnesses. The following cases occurred this month:

Cooper City Storage Plaza - Sometime between May 28, 2020 and June 4, 2020, unknown suspect(s) gained entry into a storage unit. The suspect gained entry by cutting the wire mesh, which covered the roof, and stole 2 boxes of Milwaukee multi-tool set, 7 yellow extension cords and other miscellaneous items.

RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY

The Country – Sometime between 10:45 pm on June 4, 2020 and 11:10 pm an unknown suspect(s) entered into his home without his permission. It appeared the suspect(s) entered the home through the back door of the home which was found open upon residence owner arrival home. The door may have been left unlocked. No signs of forced entry. A white gold engagement ring with stone and a gold necklace was taken.

Flamingo Gardens - At approximately 6:30 am on June 5, 2020 the residence owner reviewed his video surveillance cameras of the property and noticed on June 4, 2020 at 8:30 pm a dark colored Mercedes pulled into the driveway and a B/M exited the passenger side wearing a blue Adidas sweater, rang the doorbell, and knocked. When no one answered, the subject got back into the passenger side of the Mercedes and the vehicle is seen pulling out. At 10:37 pm two subjects were captured jumping the west side fence into the backyard and an unknown object was used to smash the master bedroom sliding glass door. The subjects ransacked the master bedroom, master closet, and bathroom and opened several draws in the office/guest room.

Cooper Colony Estates - The victim reported after waking in the morning of June 6, 2020 (at approximately 9:20 am) the victim discovered her purse was thrown onto the floor and the contents that were within her purse, which included her credit cards, driver`s license and \$16.00 in US currency, as well as other miscellaneous items, were now scattered throughout the hallway and living room area of her residence. No items were reported stolen by Sheryl at the time of this report. Sheryl advised that she believes her dog scared away the unknown suspect(s). Sheryl further stated that she believes the unknown suspect(s) entered through the unsecured garage door of the residence and unlocked interior door of the residence.

Rock Creek – At approximately 5:10 am unknown suspect(s) entered a screened patio located at the backyard and attempted to open sliding door of the residence. An audible alarm activated and more than likely deterred suspect(s). Suspect(s) left behind a pair of white latex gloves.






June 2020 - Accidents

Day of Week & Time of Day









Title: Vehicle Burglaries


