SeeClickFix

Want to report an issue in your neighborhood? **SeeClickFix** mobile app and web tools allow Cooper City residents to report issues with pictures, specific descriptions, and more — valuable information to get the job done efficiently. Residents can view, comment and vote to fix problems submitted by their neighbors, as well as tracking the status of a concern. The SeeClickFix platform provides City staff with a centralized issue management system which allows for tracking and interaction with residents from start to finish. Know Your Flood Maps, Know Your Flood Zone!

You should know if your property is located in a Special Flood Hazard Area. Contact our consultant, CRS Max Consultants by email at CRSMaxInc@bellsouth.net or 954-421-7794. Cooper City maintains Elevation Certificates through the Growth Management Department. Call 954-434-4300, ext. 249 or make a request online at www.coopercityfl.org.

The Utilities Department will respond to requests from property owners who have a flood, sewer, water, or drainage problem and discuss recommended solutions. Call 954-434-5519 to set up an on-site visit and to report a storm drain that is clogged with debris. Cooper City has ordinances that enforce NO DUMPING in the storm drains, lakes, and canals. Please call Code Compliance at 954-436-7335 to report illegal dumping.

Cooper City depends on the National Weather Service for flood warning and other weather related warnings/notifications. If flooding or a hurricane is anticipated, the Flood Warning or Hurricane Warning will be broadcast through television, radio, and internet services. Residents should monitor television, radio (preferably battery-powered), or internet weather broadcasts and be aware of special local advisories. The Broward County Hurricane Hotline is 311, or 954-831-4000 (TTY 954-831-3940).

Cooper City also has a CodeRED

Emergency Notification System which allows Cooper City Emergency Management Personnel to telephone all targeted areas of the City in case of an emergency (such as boil water, missing child or evacuation notices, etc.). To sign up, click the CodeRED button on our website at www.coopercityfl.org.

The most serious threat of general flooding is during hurricane season (June 1st through November 30th).

Do not enter flooded areas or moving water on foot or in a vehicle. The depth of the water is not always obvious. Moving water has tremendous power. Six inches of moving water has the potential to knock you off your feet, and a foot of water can sweep a large SUV off of the road. Be especially cautious at night when it is harder to recognize flood dangers. Protecting yourself today means having sources of information, preparing your home or workplace, and developing an emergency communication plan. Know what to do when a flood is approaching your home or business.

Homeowners, renters, and business owners should consider purchasing Flood Insurance now for your building and its contents! Standard homeowners' insurance does not cover flood damage. There is a 30-day waiting period for most flood insurance to become effective after purchase. 🌿

The following precautions should be taken: use insect repellent with Deet, cover skin with long sleeves and pants. Make sure that windows and screens are in good condition and empty any containers that may collect water. If unable to remove standing water, treat with larvicide. WATER SAFETY TIPS

- If a child is missing, check the water first.
- Be aware of potential dangers when visiting other homes or traveling.
- Empty all tubs, buckets, containers and wading pools immediately after use.
- Install and maintain drain covers to prevent entrapment and entanglement.
- Learn how to perform rescue breathing and CPR. Keep a phone and rescue equipment poolside.
- Pools and spas should always be closed and equipped with barriers and alarms.
- Provide constant, close and competent adult supervision of children at all times, in or near the water.
- Enroll your child in swim lessons.

WATER EMERGENCY PLAN

- 1 CALL 9-1-1
- 2 REMOVE VICTIM FROM THE WATER
- 3 PERFORM CPR IF NECESSARY

GIVE TWO BREATHS

- » If not breathing normally, pinch nose and cover mouth with your mouth and give two full breaths.

PUSH 30 TIMES

- » Position your hands on the center of the chest. Place one hand on top of the other. Push down firmly two inches and push the chest 30 times, hard and fast.

Repeat steps 1 and 2, providing 2 breaths and 30 pushes, until help arrives.
